WE ARE ON STRIKE TO FULLY FUND OUR CLASSROOMS

Dear Twin Rivers Parents,

We have made the difficult decision to strike and, though we would rather be with our students, Superintendent Martinez has left us no choice.

We are fighting for our students. We know that the school year started with 100 unfilled positions, leaving 2200 students without a teacher because Superintendent Martinez has failed to recruit and retain educators. This has become a crisis with large class sizes, a lack of support for our students' academic and emotional needs, and we are prepared to strike to fix this crisis.

We love your children and hope you'll join us in this fight to improve our schools.

What we are fighting for:

- Lower class sizes and improved services to students
- Competitive wages
- Fully-employer paid health insurance (just like Superintendent Martinez)
- An end to reliance on outside contractors

For the past six years, an independent outside auditor has repeatedly reported TRUSD's failure to meet minimum state-required classroom spending levels, depriving students of over **\$115 million** in much-needed teachers and lower class size.

OUR STUDENTS DESERVE FULLY FUNDED CLASSROOMS

TRUSD refuses to spend 55% on classrooms as required by law, but pays Steve Martinez 55% more than Gavin Newsom and provides him fully employer-paid health insurance.
